Classroom based course

Classes run twice a week in a classroom with students being taught by a trainer who guides and supports them through all aspects of the course. The trainer assists students with course content, assignments and general course work. Students are able to gain individual help from their trainer. Students must maintain 80% attendance and keep up with successfully submitting assessments, or they can be withdrawn from the course.



Practical Placement

Practical Placement allows students to complete work experience in a real-life workplace. It gives students the opportunity to gain skills and put classroom knowledge into practice. NIET has a range of places for students to undertake practical placement. Students are required to successfully complete the Practical Placement component for the course. Students generally complete placement one day a week, throughout the course.

For learners who are working in the industry, working hours maybe used for Practical Placement.

If you enrol in the dual qualifications, units which appears in both qualifications only need to be completed once.

NIET has selected the elective units based on industry feedback. Applicants who wish to select other electives should contact NIET to determine if the applicants preferred unit fits the packaging rules and if NIET has the resources to deliver the unit.

The student tuition fees as published are subject to change given individual circumstances at enrolment. An individual statement of fees will be provided to all applicants.

Fees must be paid in full two weeks before the course commences to secure your place in the course. Payment plans are available with weekly, fortnightly or monthly repayments. Payment plans attract a \$75 setup fee. A maximum of \$1,500 can be made for course payments. Payments over \$1,500 will be made over the duration of the course.

You require a clear NDIS and Police Check - we can assist you with how to apply. It is highly recommended that you be fully COVID vaccinated, to work in this industry and to undertake placement, however it is not mandatory.

Pre-Training Review

Prospective students are booked in for a pre-training review with a NIET staff member, to answer any questions about the course and to ensure the course is suitable for their skill level and career expectations. During the review the following topics are covered:

WHICH COURSE IS BEST FOR ME?

You may be interested in working in disability or aged care but are not sure which course is the most suitable. This information sheet provides an overview of the courses, so that you can choose the course that suits you and your employment outcome best.

CHC43115 Certificate IV in Disability

When you work in disability services you can have a profound impact on someone's life. In this course you will learn the knowledge and skills needed to provide support to someone who needs it the most, helping them to become more independent and confident in their own abilities. The person-centred philosophy and strength-based approaches are best practice and are covered throughout this course. Working in the disability sector allows you to interact with a diverse range of people, from teenagers and young adults, through to older clients.

CHC43015 Certificate IV in Ageing Support

When you work in aged care you can gain personal satisfaction from the work you do. This course focuses on individual goals, personal care requirements and support for those in residential aged care, as well as those that are living in their own homes. The course provides you with the knowledge and skills to identify and demonstrate person centred care, with a strength-based focus, incorporating dignity of risk and client empowerment.

CHC43415 Certificate IV in Leisure and Health

This course focuses on holistic support and care of people, by learning to implement both mental and physical activities that are personalised and appropriate for the client. Providing personalised activities brings value and enjoyment to a person's well-being and their quality of life is enhanced. By planning, organising and evaluating a range of activities, it allows clients to maintain their connection to the community by learning new skills, maintaining friendships, and participating in experiences that gives them events to look forward to.

Dual qualifications

Completing the single Certificate IV in Disability or the Certificate IV in Ageing Support is a great way to gain employment in the disability or aged care sector. Completing the Certificate IV in Leisure and Health, alongside the disability or ageing support course, enhances your knowledge of holistic well-being and care, and can broaden your employment options. The dual qualification allows you to implement and monitor activity programs for individuals or groups. Emphasising patient care and well-being, the dual qualification is highly regarded, as it enhances the current philosophies of holistic care and support as best practice.

All assessments must be successfully completed one week after the course end date. If you do not successfully complete all assessments by the course end date, a \$500 fee will apply.
