FLEXIBLE DELIVERY

How does Flexible Learning work?



Flexible Learning is a combination of learning methods that gives you the freedom to learn from any location, using printed learning materials and accessing a pre-recorded webinar for each subject. Learning is completed through reading materials, such as a textbook, and your assessment can be handwritten or typed up, depending on what suits you. There is also a class you attend in person, to learn the hands-on practical skills that are required. This class is usually held on a weekend, in a central location.

We support you to successfully pass, by assisting you to complete the following for every subject, which takes around four hours per week:

- Read a chapter from the textbook
- Watch the pre-recorded webinar
- Read the PowerPoint slides from the webinar
- Complete the assessment in handwriting, or by typing up the answers
- Contact your teacher if you have any questions
- Submit the assessment by the due date for each subject.

Your teacher guides you through all aspects, such as course content, assessments and general course work. Your teacher will also conduct a class, where you attend in person, to complete practical tasks. Students are enrolled in blocks, so that they are not overwhelmed by being enrolled in the full course all at once. Each block has a completion date, however you can complete earlier, but not later. You must keep up with successfully submitting assessments on-time, or you may need to pay \$500 to re-enrol and have new dates allocated to your subjects.

Practical Placement

Practical Placement allows students to complete work experience in a real-life workplace. It gives students the opportunity to gain skills and put the knowledge learnt into practice. Students are required to successfully complete the Practical Placement component for the course. If you are already working in the industry, working hours maybe used for Practical Placement.

The student tuition fees as published are subject to change given individual circumstances at enrolment. An individual statement of fees will be provided to all applicants.

Fees must be paid in full two weeks before the course commences to secure your place. Payment plans are available with weekly, fortnightly, or monthly repayments. Payment plans attract a \$75 setup fee. A maximum of \$1,500 can be made for course payments. Payments over \$1,500 will be made over the duration of the course.

You require a Working with Children's Check, Police Check and to be fully COVID vaccinated to work in this industry and to undertake placement.

Pre-Training Review

Prospective students are booked in for a pre-training review with a NIET staff member, to answer any questions about the course and to ensure the course is suitable for their skill level and career expectations. During the review the following topics are covered:

- Course suitability and likely opportunities
- Existing educational qualifications job and any adjustments that may apply
- Identify any support requirements for the student
- Support for equity and disadvantaged
- Course and study requirements
- Assessment of Literacy, Language and Numeracy level for the qualification
