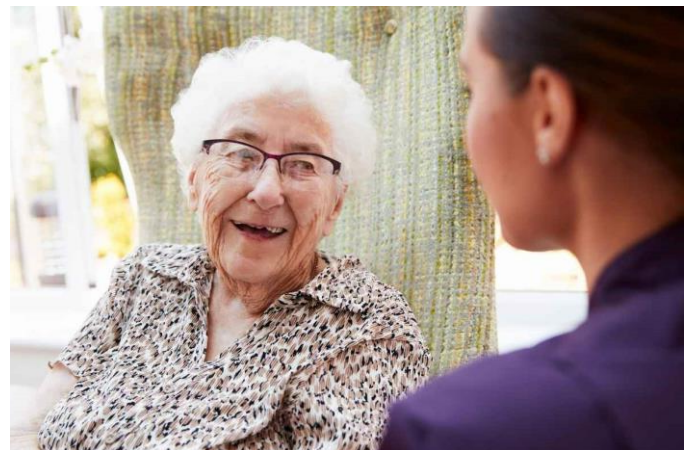

How does Flexible Delivery work?

Flexible Delivery is a combination of learning methods that gives you the freedom to learn from any location, using printed learning materials and accessing a pre-recorded webinar for each subject. Learning is completed through reading materials, such as Learner Guides and your assessment can be handwritten or typed up, depending on what suits you. There is also a class you need to attend in person, to learn the hands-on practical skills that are required. This class is offered at night and on weekends.

We support you to successfully complete, by assisting you with the following for every subject, which takes around seven hours per week:

- Read the Learner Guide
- Watch the pre-recorded webinar
- Read the PowerPoint slides from the webinar
- Complete the assessment in handwriting or by typing the answers
- Contact your teacher if you have any questions
- Submit the assessment by the due date for each subject.

Your teacher guides you through all aspects, such as course content, assessments and general course work. Your teacher will also conduct a class, where you attend in person, to complete practical tasks. You must keep up with successfully submitting assessments on-time, or you may need to pay \$500 to re-enrol and have new dates allocated to your subjects.

Practical Placement

Practical Placement allows students to complete work experience in a real-life workplace. It gives students the opportunity to gain skills and put classroom knowledge into practice. NIET has a range of places for students to undertake Practical Placement and gain valuable skills and connections. Students are required to successfully complete Practical Placement to gain the qualification. For learners who are working in the industry, working hours may be used for Practical Placement with the approval of the employer.

Assessment methods

NIET uses a range of assessment methods including:

- Written assessments
- Projects
- Case studies and scenarios
- Workplace portfolios
- Practical Placement logbook
- Practical Placement observations by NIET assessor

The student tuition fees as published are subject to change given individual circumstances at enrolment. An individual statement of fees will be provided to all applicants.

Fees must be paid in full two weeks before the course commences to secure your place in the course. Payment plans are available with weekly, fortnightly, or monthly repayments. Payment plans attract a \$75 setup fee. A maximum of \$1,500 can be made for course payments. Payments over \$1,500 will be made over the duration of the course.

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ENROLMENT PROCESS

Industry requirements

We highly advise obtaining complete COVID vaccination for working in the disability industry and participating in placement, however it is not mandatory. To work in the age care industry and engage in practical placement, you must have a current flu vaccination and be fully COVID vaccinated.

In both aged care and disability industries, you will need to have Police Check and Working with Children's Check. Additionally, for working in the disability industry, you may require a NDIS screening check. These checks should be acquired prior to the commencement of the first class. Should you need assistance, we are here to help you.

Pre-Training Review

Prospective students are booked in for a pre-training review with a NIET staff member, to answer any questions about the course and to ensure the course is suitable for their skill level and career expectations. During the review the following topics are covered:

- Course suitability and likely job opportunities
- Existing educational qualifications and any adjustments that may apply
- Identify any support requirements
- Support for equity and disadvantaged
- Course and study requirements
- Assessment of Literacy, Language and Numeracy level for the qualification
