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Classroom based course

Classes run two days per week in a classroom with student's being taught by a trainer who guides and supports them through all aspects of the course. Trainers assist students with course content, assignments, and general course work. Students are able to gain individual help from their trainer. Students must maintain 80% attendance and keep up with successfully submitting assessments, or you can be withdrawn from the course.



Practical Placement

Practical Placement allows students to complete work experience in a real-life workplace. It gives students the opportunity to gain skills and put classroom knowledge into practice.

Students need to successfully complete the Practical Placement component for the course. NIET has a range of places for students to undertake Practical Placement. Students generally complete placement one day a week during the course.

For learners who are working in the industry, working hours may be used for Practical Placement with the approval of the employer.

Assessment Methods

The student tuition fees as published are subject to change given individual circumstances at enrolment. An individual statement of fees will be provided to all applicants.

All fees must be paid in full two weeks before the course commences to secure your place in the course. Payment plans are available with weekly, fortnightly, or monthly repayments. Payment plans attract a \$75 setup fee. A maximum of \$1,500 can be made for course payments. Payments over \$1,500 will be made over the duration of the course.

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ENROLMENT PROCESS

Industry Requirements

You require a current flu vaccination and full COVID vaccination to work in the age care industry, and to undertake practical placement. You will also need a current clear Police check and Working with Children's Check. Should you need assistance, we are here to help you.

Pre-Training Review

Prospective students are booked in for a pre-training review with a NIET staff member, to answer any questions about the course and to ensure the course is suitable for their skill level and career expectations. During the review the following topics are covered:

- Course suitability and likely job opportunities
- Existing educational qualifications and any adjustments that may apply
- Identify any support requirements
- Support for equity and disadvantaged
- Course and study requirements
- Assessment of Literacy, Language and Numeracy level for the qualification



Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN)

As part of the pre-training review prospective students take part in a Language, Literacy and Numeracy assessment that allows students to into a course that is at the correct level for them.

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) and Credit Transfer
