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Classroom based course

Classes run two days per week in a classroom with student's being taught by a trainer who guides and supports them through all aspects of the course. Trainers assist students with course content, assignments and general course work. Students are able to gain individual help from their trainer.

Practical Placement

Practical Placement allows students to complete work experience in a real-life workplace. It gives students the opportunity to gain skills and put classroom knowledge into practice. Students are required to successfully complete a Practical Placement component for the course. NIET has connections with a range of places for students to undertake Practical Placement.

For learners who are working in the industry, working hours may be used for Practical Placement with the approval of the employer.

If you enrol in the dual qualification, units which appears in both qualifications only need to be completed once.

NIET has selected the elective units based on industry feedback. Applicants who wish to select other electives should contact NIET to determine if the applicants preferred units fits the packaging rules and if NIET has the resources to deliver the unit.

Industry Requirements

A current Police Check is mandatory in this field of employment. You are required to obtain a current Police Check by the start of your first class. We can assist you with applying for a Police Check.

Minimum age requirements

If under the age of 18, a parent/guardian signature will be required for enrolment and at various stages throughout the course.

Pre-Training Review

Prospective students are booked in for a pre-training review with a NIET staff member, to answer any questions about the course and to ensure the course is suitable for their skill level and career expectations. During the review the following topics are discussed:

- Course suitability
- Likely job opportunities
- Existing educational qualifications and any adjustments that may apply
- Identify any support requirements for the student
- Support for equity and disadvantaged
