Classroom based course

If you enrol in the dual qualifications, units which appears in both qualifications only need to be completed once.

NIET has selected the elective units based on industry feedback. Applicants who wish to select other electives should contact NIET to determine if the applicants preferred unit fits the packaging rules and if NIET has the resources to deliver the unit.

ENROLMENT PROCESS

Industry Requirements

A current Police Check and Working with Children's check is mandatory in this field of employment. You are required to obtain these by the start of your first class and we can assist you with how to apply.

Minimum age requirements

If under the age of 18, a parent/guardian signature will be required for enrolment and at various stages throughout the course.

Pre-Training Review

Prospective students are booked in for a pre-training review with a qualified NIET staff member, to answer any questions about the course and to ensure the course is suitable for their skill level and career expectations. During the review the following topics are discussed:

- Course suitability
- Likely job opportunities
- Existing educational qualifications and any adjustments that may apply
- Identify any support requirements for the student
- Support for equity and disadvantaged
- Ensure student is well informed of course and study requirements
- Assessment of Language, Literacy and Numeracy level for the qualification.

WHICH COURSE IS BEST FOR ME?

You may be interested in working in disability or aged care, but are not sure which course is the most suitable. This information sheet provides an overview of the courses, so that you can choose the course that suits you and your employment outcome best.

Certificate IV in Disability - CHC43115

When you work in disability services you can have a profound impact on someone's life. In this course you will learn the knowledge and skills needed to provide support to someone who needs it the most, helping them to become more independent and confident in their own abilities. The person-centred philosophy and strength-based approaches are best practice, and are covered throughout this course. Working in the disability sector allows you to interact with a diverse range of people, from teenagers and young adults, through to older clients.

Certificate IV in Ageing Support - CHC43015

When you work in aged care you can gain personal satisfaction from the work you do. This course focuses on individual goals, personal care requirements and support for those in residential aged care, as well as those that are living in their own homes. The course provides you with the knowledge and skills to identify and demonstrate person centred care, with a strength-based focus, incorporating dignity of risk and client empowerment. This qualification can be used for employment in the disability sector.

Certificate IV in Leisure and Health – CHC43415

This course focuses on holistic support and care of people, by providing both mental and physical activities that are personalised and appropriate for the client. Client well-being and their quality of life is enhanced through creating a social care plan, that covers the goals, and what activities and experiences gives meaning to each person's life. You will learn the skills and knowledge required to support people to maintain their connection to the community, through activities, learning new skills, maintaining friendships and participating in experiences that making new memories.

Dual qualifications

Completing the Certificate IV in Disability or the Certificate IV in Ageing Support is a great way to gain employment in the disability or aged care sector. Completing the Certificate IV in Leisure and Health, alongside the disability or ageing support course, assists you to enhance your knowledge of holistic well-being and care, and broadens your employment options.
